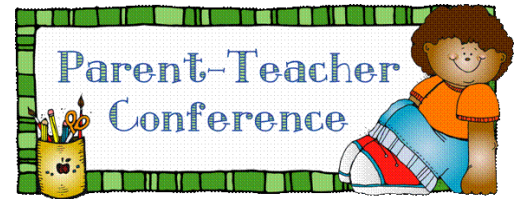
The Giving Trees have arrived! December at The Giving Nest

makes its debut with our "Giving Trees" located in the hallway. When the trees first appear, they are awaiting decorations. Soon child- made decorations will adorn the trees. During Morning Sing time Mrs. Amy will explain the purpose of our Giving Tree - to help others. First, we ask the children where do we get our food from, where do we buy our clothes and house items. The Supermarket and the store are enthusiastically called out (Target and Shoprite). We then discuss how lucky we are that we can go to any store to get what we need. Our Mommy's and Daddy's are able to bring us home whatever we like. We then begin to wonder if everyone is able to go to any store they want to? We explain that not everyone is as fortunate as we may be. We explain that there are places where children go with their families to get basic items that we need every day called special shelters/homes. These homes collect items (food, clothing toys, etc.) so that family's that need these items can go to and pick what they need. Usually, one child wonders how we can help out others that cannot get what they need. Another may ask if there is anything we could do to help other families. We then ask, "Do you want to help these children and families?" Hopefully one student will suggest, " Let's buy food and toys for them." we exclaim. "What a great idea! But we need money to buy these items." Next question is "How does one get money?" We are looking for the response, "People work to make money." After clarifying that they are too young to go out and get a job, we explore some of the jobs the children can do at home this week (making their bed, doing the dishes, cleaning up toys). We suggest, "Perhaps on this special occasion you could ask your parents to pay you for doing a special chore at home and you can donate this so we can send this to families who live in these special homes. The children then share with the class what chore they want to do at home.

## Parent Teacher Conferences:

The week of January 3<sup>rd</sup>, the Chickadee, Duckling, Bluebird and Cardinal parents will receive an email to sign up for Parent/Teacher Conferences scheduled in mid-January. This is an opportunity for you to sit with your child's teacher to discuss his/her progress report and answer any questions you may have.

Progress Reports will be sent home the week of January 9<sup>th</sup>. Specifics on dates and times will be included in the email. Conferences are 15 minutes long. It is very important to be on time for your conference as we do schedule them back-to-back. If you are late, your scheduled conference will still end at the scheduled time.



## Winter Weather and School Closings...

If we need to close due to snow or other inclement weather, you will be informed via e-mail. Please check your email by approximately 7:00 AM. If you need to know before 7:00 you may call the school, there may be a message on the machine by 6:30am. The delayed opening schedule is below, please note these times may be changed depending on the conditions. THERE WILL BE NO EARLY CARE ON DELAYED OPENING DAYS.

In the past we have had difficult situations when the snow started falling after school began. If it is snowing hard after you have dropped off your child, please err on the side of caution and come back to get your child.

All Other Classes:

Full Day Classes 10:30am to 3:15pm

\*There will be no Early Care on delayed opening days.

**Reminder! Influenza vaccine:** Children 6 months through 59 months attending any childcare or preschool facility must annually receive at least one dose of influenza vaccine between September 1 & December 31 each year. It is very important you comply with this state mandate. The state sends a nurse to the preschools to check each child's medical paperwork and ascertain all shots have been administered. If shots are not up to date the child may have to leave the school. The nurse checks all immunizations. If you have any questions or concerns, please call the school to discuss with Mrs. Amy. Please send in all Influenza records no later than December 31<sup>st</sup>. Thank you!
