Artist of the Month: Georges Seurat

Seurat is considered one of the most important <u>post-Impressionist</u> painters. He moved away from the apparent spontaneity and rapidity of <u>Impressionism</u> and developed a structured, more monumental art to depict modern urban life.

<u>Pointillism</u> is a technique of painting in which small, distinct dots of color are applied in patterns to form an image.

Georges Seurat and Paul Signac developed the technique in 1886, branching from Impressionism.
