Has your child gotten their flu shot?

NJ State Mandate Influenza Vaccine: Children 6mo-59mo attending any childcare or preschool facility must annually receive at least one dose of influenza vaccine between September 1 & December 31st each year. It is very important you comply with this state mandate. The state sends a nurse to the preschools to check each child's medical records and make certain that all shots have been administered. If shots are not up to date and/or documentation not provided, the child may have to leave the school. If you have any questions, please call the school to speak to Mrs. Tracy. Thank you!
