All month the children will be learning about the 5 Senses. We will perform different experiments to determine which of the five senses will be used in reaching a conclusion.

The children will participate in a "Five Senses/Differently Abled" Workshop. Within the classroom, the children will visit different stations: each exploring the five senses. They will also learn to appreciate and accept that some children and adults have different abilities. Some of these activities include creating their own words in "Braille" and playing basketball in a wheelchair to understand that people with handicaps can do many of the things that they can do, they just do it differently!

The children will create their own shamrocks but cutting out other shapes. They will cut out small hearts to create the leaves and a triangle to create the stem.
