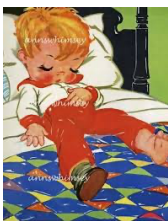


Letters of the Month

Li, Ff, Ee



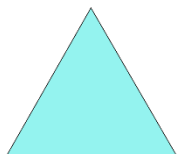

Colors of the Month

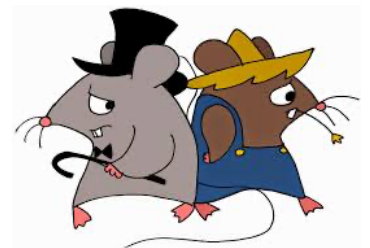
Brown- Let's paint with brown potatoes!

Duckling Theme for November

"Home is Where the Heart is"

This month we will introduce our Home Unit. During class we will talk about the things that make a house a home: families, love, caring, etc. We will introduce the idea that not everyone lives in the same type of house. The children will further explore this concept by making igloos, gluing shapes onto teepees, decorating an apartment complex, and replicated their own homes.

The children will play "What Goes Where?" The teacher will place several small bags with pictures of different rooms in the house in front of the children in small group. Together the children will identify which room of the house each bag represents. Each child will then be given pictures of objects typically found in a home. The children will take turns placing their objects in the appropriate bags. For example: an oven will go in the kitchen bag, a toothbrush will go in the bathroom bag.



Skills Introduced This Month

Using Scissors & Cutting Lines on Index Cards

Cutting with scissors is an important fine motor skill that our three-year-olds will be working on throughout the year at The Giving Nest. This month the children will continue with scissor exercises and games that instruct the proper way to hold the scissors. (We use the *Fiskar* child scissors.)
