



Shape of the Month




Ground Hog Day

The children will go outside with their class and stand in the sun in the parking lot. The teachers will trace the children's shadows and print their names in the middle.

Presidents Washington and Lincoln

We will discuss the achievements of Washington and Lincoln and stress that even as children they tried to do the right thing. We will also explain that like us, they sometimes made mistakes. For example, George cut down the cherry tree as a little boy. We will explain how important it is to be truthful and honest and that Abraham Lincoln's nickname is "Honest Abe". We will talk about the difference between truth and a lie. The teacher will tell them some short phrases and ask whether the phrase is the truth or a lie. Some examples are: *Children should eat breakfast, lunch, and dinner...* *Lots of candy makes children big and strong...* *The moon is made of green cheese...* *At night we can see the moon...* etc.

Valentine's Day



Valentine's Day is the perfect opportunity for you to explain to your child how our mail system works. You will receive a blank envelope in your child's folder at the beginning of the month.
