New Year Resolutions

The arrival of the new year will be celebrated throughout the school! In addition, each class will be challenged with a new skill to accomplish in the new year.

The Hummingbirds have been practicing throwing away their trash when finished eating snack and lunch. This includes taking any paper or empty disposable containers to the garbage then returning to their seats!

The Chickadees have been practicing how to enter the classroom and unpack their own backpacks. This includes hanging their jackets and backpack in their cubby and unpacking their water bottle and placing it on their cubby shelf!

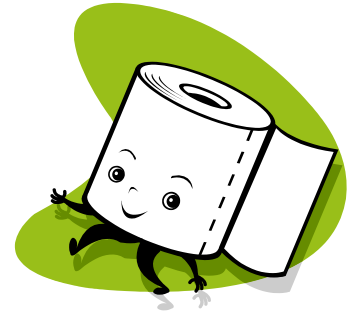
The teachers have certificates to present to the children when they have successfully mastered the skill. Look for this in your child's backpack.

Please note these are important skills to develop at your child's age. If he or she is having trouble perhaps you can practice his/her classes' selected skill at home. Several of the children in each age group may have already mastered these skills, which is great. They will receive a certificate once they demonstrate the skill for their teacher.

Helpful tips for a healthy toddler this winter...

1. Wash hands frequently for at least 20 seconds.
2. Give child ample rest and recovery time after illness.
3. Discard & replace toothbrushes after a cold or illness.
4. Consistent bedtimes and naps.
5. "Cover our mouth when we cough or sneeze".
6. Wear seasonally appropriate shoes, clothing and jackets for outside play.
7. Flu vaccine

If your child practiced potty training over the holiday break remember to tell their teacher so we can assist with their progress and cheer them on! Please remember to use pullups that detach at the sides for a more efficient changing process. Thank you!
